LIBRARY FOR THE BLIND & PHYSICAL HANDICA



LBPH provides a full range of reading and tactile materials, as well as book clubs and innovative cultural and educational programs. LBPH also manages the Maryland Accessible Textbook (MAT) program, which provides print-disabled students in higher education programs with their required course textbooks in a converted format.
